

Juniors interested in going on the Honduras Youth Mission Trip (HYMT) should exhibit the following qualities:

- Trustworthy
 - Students will be representing not only themselves while on the HYMT. They will be representing their families, their schools, their hometowns, the Catholic Diocese of Dallas, the state of Texas, and the United States. One should not be able to call into question their integrity, commitment, or judgment.
- Adventurous
 - Students will be asked to do many things they've never done before. A sense of adventure will come in handy and make the experience that much easier.
- Christian attitude
 - Students will be expected to exhibit Christ-like behavior at all times.
- Open-minded
 - Students may be exposed to new ideas and opinions while on the trip, and should allow themselves to have "the total experience".
- Humble
 - Students will be faced with instances of extreme poverty, some for the first time. Often the food and hospitality offered by the people of Honduras is a true sacrifice for them.
- Hard-working
 - Students will be asked to do a variety of tasks, including manual labor.
- Modest
 - Students should expect to wear simple and modest clothing, and go without the luxuries of make-up, a hair dryer, etc.

Additionally, missionaries are asked to contribute a lot of time towards the mission prior to going on the actual trip. These commitments include:

- Attending regular meetings (see schedule on website)
- Reading Enrique's Journey (once optional, now **mandatory**)
- Attending the retreat in the spring
- Assisting with fundraising as needed
- Assisting and participating in the spring Honduras School Supply Drive
- Submitting all documentation in a timely manner (FIRM APRIL 1st DEADLINE)
